Did You Know: Interesting Facts About Leap Day

Although Leap Year doesn't fall onto our calendars until the year 2020, here are some interesting facts about the "rarely" there day that you might find interesting:

- 1. It takes the earth one day to complete one spin on its axis. The time it takes the earth to complete one trip around the sun is one year. But these units of time don't divide evenly, resulting in our calendar year being 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes and a little over 45 seconds long. Every 4 years we take those extra hours and minutes and fit it in an extra day, on February 29th, which we call Leap Day.
- 2. The leap year was introduced in 46 BC, by Roman leader Julius Caesar. In case you're wondering, credit probably goes to his astronomer for figuring out a simple solution to the problem of extra time.
- 3. If we did not have the extra day every 4 years, in 100 years our calendar would be off by 24 days.
- 4. The Chinese calendar has a leap month about every 3 years and the name of the leap month is the same as the previous lunar month. The Jewish calendar has a leap year 7 times in a 19-year cycle.
- 5. People born on February 29 are called "leaplings" or "leapers". The chance of being born on a leap day is one in 1,461. There are five million leaplings around the world.
- 6. Workers on fixed annual salaries have to work leap days for free: the rate does not account for an extra day. Same goes if you are sentenced to a year in jail, if your sentence lands in a leap year, you'll have to serve the extra day.
- Frogs are associated with leap years, perhaps because of their remarkable leaping abilities
- 8. The next Leap Day will be on Saturday February 29th, 2020



Blythe Intaglios

The word intaglio is Italian and refers to an engraving process. The figures are incised on the ground by scraping away the darker layer of rocks or pebbles to reveal a stratum of lighter soil. The displaced rocks outline the figures and the exposed soil is stamped down which makes it more difficult for plants to grow in the lines.

There are roughly 600 Intaglios present in the Southwest area of the United States and over 200 are in the Colorado River area. The ones located in Blythe are the largest along the river area and are considered among the 10 best in the world. Intaglios often depict mountain lions, birds, snakes, and unidentified animal like figures and geometric shapes but the human figures are only found near the Colorado River.

Within the Blythe Intaglios the largest figure is a <u>women</u> which 175 ft. long and outstretched arms span 158 ft. Near her is an anatomically correct <u>male figure</u> about 95 ft. tall. A 150 ft. <u>snake intaglio</u> depicts a rattlesnake whose eyes are captured in the form of two rock but has been damaged by vehicles over time. There's also a 53 ft. long four-footed creature alternatively identified as a <u>panther</u>, a <u>coyote or a horse</u>. The <u>Fisherman Intaglio</u> depicts a man with a spear, two fish below him and a sum and serpent above. <u>Various geometric lines</u> and a <u>dance ring</u> are also present.

The Blythe Intaglios were first spotted by an Army Air Corps pilot in Nov of 1931 as he flew from Hoover Dam to Los Angeles. He reported his findings to the Southwest Museum but due to the Depression it wasn't investigated until 1952. By that time damage had been done by General George Patton's troops as there are visual mark of tire tracks. To protect the area the BLM erected fencing in 1974 and the area was placed on the Nation Register of Historic Places in 1982.

How old are they? No one know for sure but speculate between 450 to 2,000 yrs.

Who made them? Possibly the Mohave and Quechan Indians.

Why did they make them? If you ask members of tribal societies that still exist in the area the human figures represent Mastamho, the Creator of life and the animal figures represent Hatakulya, one of the two mountain lions/persons who helped with in the creation. Since they are best viewed from the sky it is a type of offering or tribute to the Gods.

One point archaeologists & scientists can agree on is: The greatest value of the Blythe Intaglios may be their ability to preserve the cultural identity of the Native American people.



- HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -- Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on H4W runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point all in working order. RATING **DESCRIPTION** 1 EASIEST: Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades. 2 EASY: Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving. 3 EASIEST MODERATE: 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane. MODERATE: Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop -offs and tight clearance between rocks. 31/2 HARDER MODERATE: For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Potentially dangerous, large rocks, ruts, steep slopes, loose surface and narrow clearances that need to be negotiated. 33/4 HARDEST MODERATE: Skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with both differentials locked, some strapping/winching. Very challenging sections, extremely steep grades, loose surfaces, large rocks, deep ruts and tight clearances. DIFFICULT: Highly skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with belly up, 4 to 1 transfer case or equivalent, skid plates, beefed up 4 axles and suspension system. Probable strapping/winching. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage. HARD: All of the above. Probable body damage.
