




#### Aubrey Loop March 24, 2020



#### Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)

#### The Basics for Havasu 4-Wheelers

#### 3 basic types of defibrillators: Manual, AICD and AED

An AED is a Lightweight, Battery-operated, Computerized Portable device.

Delivers an electric shock through the chest to the heart via a pair of self-stick pads called 'electrodes'.

#### Like defibrillators on TV, only automated (John & Roy)

Used on medical dramas and reality shows on television. ("Clear!").

Unlike manual defibrillators used by paramedics and physicians, the important decisions are made by the AED.

The shock can potentially stop an irregular heart beat (arrhythmia) and allow a normal rhythm to resume following sudden cardiac arrest (SCA). SCA occurs when the heart malfunctions and stops beating unexpectedly. If not treated within minutes, it quickly leads to death.

Ventricular fibrillation (VFib) is a rapid and unsynchronized heart rhythm that originates in the heart's lower chambers (the ventricles). The heart must be "defibrillated" quickly because: A victim's chance of surviving drops by 7 to 10% for every minute a normal heartbeat isn't restored.

#### How an AED works

Turn it on and place the pads (below the right collarbone and left side about two inches below the left armpit), it immediately begins analyzing the victim's heart rhythm. It checks only for cardiac dysrhythmias such as V-filb or Pulseless Ventricular Tachycardia it then calculates whether defibrillation is needed, and provides directions to the operator. This is done via both voice prompts and indicators displayed on a faceplate on the AED. If the AED senses that the victim is in cardiac arrest, it advises the operator in a matter of seconds to push a button to deliver a shock. This shock momentarily stuns the heart and stops all activity. It gives the heart the chance to resume beating effectively.

#### Risk factors


Factors that may increase the risk of V-fib include:

- I. A previous episode of ventricular fibrillation;
- A previous heart attack;
- 3. Congenital heart disease;
- 4. Heart muscle disease (cardiomyopathy);
- 5. Injuries to the heart muscle, such as electrocution;
- 6. Use of illegal drugs, such as cocaine or methamphetamine, and
- 7. Significant electrolyte abnormalities, such as with potassium or magnesium.

#### AEDs are known to be virtually foolproof

As long as an AED is turned on, it is designed to be next to foolproof:

- It will not prompt the operator to go to the next step until the previous step has been completed;
- It provides a direction sequence that is so logical, that rescuers remain calm, even those with little or no experience in responding to cardiac emergencies;
- 3. It will not allow a shock to be administered unless the person is actually in cardiac arrest.



#### Why are AEDs important?

- 1 Rapid activation of 9-1-1 system and
- 2. Prompt delivery of (CPR) and
- 3. Early defibrillation.

All three of these activities are vital to improving survival from SCA.

#### Almost anyone can use an AED

Anyone familiar with the device. Formal training is not required, it is recommended to help the rescuer increase their comfort and level of confidence.

Such use is permitted by "Good Samaritan Laws" in every state, which generally protects the rescuer, the Club and the Medical Director who oversees the program from civil tort liability.

#### AEDs are safe to use

AEDs are safe to use by anyone familiar with their use. AEDs are highly effective in detecting when (or when not) to deliver a shock. To ensure the safest operation, avoid use on metal or wet surfaces. No Patient contact.

#### Where do we often find AEDs?

AEDs are often located in public areas such as sports venues, shopping mails, airports, airplanes, businesses, annivertion centers, hotels, schools and doctors' offices. They should also be in any other public or private place where large numbers of people gather or where people at high risk for heart attacks live. They should be placed near elevators, cafeterias, main reception areas, and on walls in main corridors.

Havesu 4-Wheeler (H4W) club AEDs should be brought to all club events where several members will gather. However, there is no legal requirement to have an AED available at any club function or run. This will take initiative of club members to see that at least one device is available where desired. On Club runs, it is recommended that the vehicle carrying an AED keep in the middle of the pack so, if needed, it is more accessible for immediate use.

#### We own 3 Defibtech Lifeline AEDs

- It is extremely easy to use
- There are only two buttons and no moving parts or lids to slow the rescue.
- Clear voice prompts and status lights will guide the rescuer through the entire process.

#### Where can I get AED training?

Numerous community organizations offer AED courses. The H4W club usually offers at least one AED course during each calendar year. Check with your AED presenter Brian Springer for future classes.

You are encouraged to attend an initial class and subsequent classes until you are confident that you can operate the AED in an emergency.

#### - HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -- Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on H4W runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point ..... all in working order. RATING **DESCRIPTION** 1 EASIEST: Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades. EASY: Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving. 2 3 EASIEST MODERATE: 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane. 31/4 MODERATE: Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop -offs and tight clearance between rocks. 31/2 HARDER MODERATE: For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Potentially dangerous, large rocks, ruts, steep slopes, loose surface and narrow clearances that need to be negotiated. 33/4 HARDEST MODERATE: Skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with both differentials locked, some strapping/winching. Very challenging sections, extremely steep grades, loose surfaces, large rocks, deep ruts and tight clearances. DIFFICULT: Highly skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with belly up, 4 to 1 transfer case or equivalent, skid plates, beefed up 4 axles and suspension system. Probable strapping/winching. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage. HARD: All of the above. Probable body damage.
