March By Law Changes Voted in at the April General Meeting

Change: Remove from SOP's and place in the By-Laws under ARTICLE VII

IV: SPECIAL COMMITTEES

STANDING COMMITTEES

1. PURPOSE

The following Standing Committee(s) shall be appointed and shall report directly to the Board of Directors (BOD). Committee chairpersons shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the president as defined in Article IX of the By-laws. Chairpersons shall select committee members, if required. Committee's shall perform the duties described below and any other requested by the BOD. Committee's shall serve for the duration pf office of the president that appointed them and shall be automatically discharged at the end of that term

2. COMMITTEES AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES

MEMBERSHIP committee shall be responsible for accepting, processing, reviewing and maintaining records of membership information. Shall determine the number of voting members present so it may be known if a quorum in attendance and shall keep a file of system of membership. The chairperson, as an elected member-at-large as defined in Article VI 1.A of the By-laws, or a designated representative, shall attend all BOD and general membership meetings.

<u>RUNS</u> committee shall be responsible for <u>organizing</u> all sponsored Club runs. They shall also record and maintain all Club waivers signed by guests on Club sponsored runs.

A. Duties of Run Committee Chairperson:

- 1. Establish a training class for novice off-road drivers. The classes shall be held at least twice a year in a place to be selected by the Chairperson. The class shall consist of lecture and actual off-road application.
- 2. Establish a monthly trail boss meeting.

By-Law changes

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES AND POWERS OF OFFICERS

- 5. MEMBERSHIP Chairperson shall be responsible for accepting, processing, reviewing and maintaining records of membership information. Shall determine the number of voting members present at the membership meeting so it may be known if a quorum is in attendance and shall keep a file system of membership for a period of 4 yrs. The chairperson shall attend all BOD and general membership meetings.
- 6. RUNS Chairperson shall be responsible for documenting all sponsored Club runs. Shall also record and maintain all Club waivers signed by guests on Club sponsored runs for a period of 7yrs.

ARTICLE VII


Potash Road, Shaffer Switchbacks, Long Canyon





Onion Creek, Thompson Canyon, Polar Mesa

Thursday, May 6 was the day we took 8 Havasu 4-Wheelers through Onion Creek, where it is always fun to count the water crossings. We agreed there were 30 shallow water crossings through Onion Creek. Leaving Onion Creek, we entered Thompson Canyon where we stopped at an abandoned shack purportedly to be Butch Cassidy's Hideout.

Moving on through Thompson Canyon we stopped for lunch at the intersection which will ultimately take us up to Polar Mesa.





- HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -- Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on H4W runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point all in working order. RATING **DESCRIPTION** 1 EASIEST: Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades. EASY: Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving. 2 3 EASIEST MODERATE: 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane. 31/4 MODERATE: Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop -offs and tight clearance between rocks. 31/2 HARDER MODERATE: For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage. HARD: All of the above. Probable body damage.
