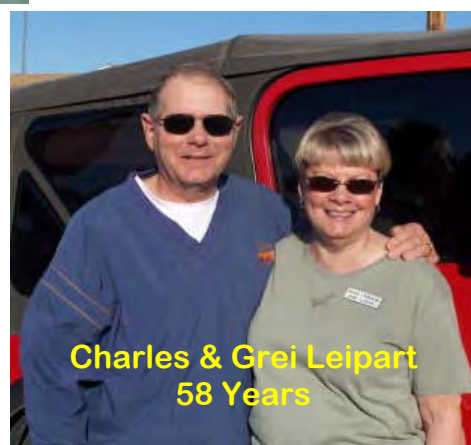

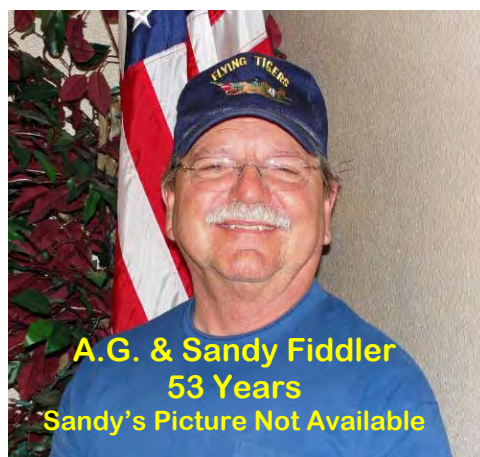

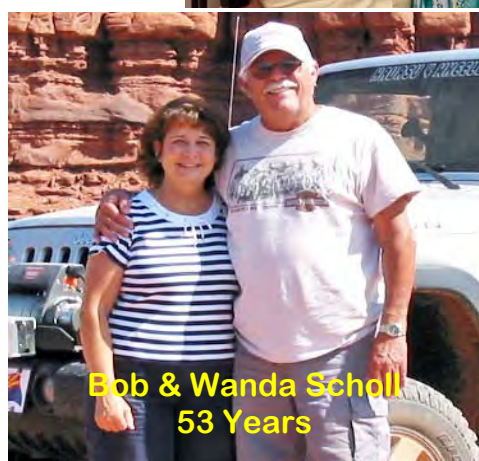

March By Law Changes Voted in at the April General Meeting

Change: Remove from SOP's and place in the By-Laws under ARTICLE VII

IV: SPECIAL COMMITTEES

STANDING COMMITTEES

1. PURPOSE

The following Standing Committee(s) shall be appointed and shall report directly to the Board of Directors (BOD). Committee chairpersons shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the president as defined in Article IX of the By-laws. Chairpersons shall select committee members, if required. Committee's shall perform the duties described below and any other requested by the BOD. Committee's shall serve for the duration of office of the president that appointed them and shall be automatically discharged at the end of that term

2. COMMITTEES AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES

MEMBERSHIP committee shall be responsible for accepting, processing, reviewing and maintaining records of membership information. Shall determine the number of voting members present so it may be known if a quorum is in attendance and shall keep a file of system of membership. The chairperson, as an elected member-at-large as defined in Article VI 1.A of the By-laws, or a designated representative, shall attend all BOD and general membership meetings.

RUNS committee shall be responsible for organizing all sponsored Club runs. They shall also record and maintain all Club waivers signed by guests on Club sponsored runs.

A. Duties of Run Committee Chairperson:

1. Establish a training class for novice off-road drivers. The classes shall be held at least twice a year in a place to be selected by the Chairperson. The class shall consist of lecture and actual off-road application.
2. Establish a monthly trail boss meeting.

By-Law changes

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES AND POWERS OF OFFICERS

5. MEMBERSHIP Chairperson shall be responsible for accepting, processing, reviewing and maintaining records of membership information. Shall determine the number of voting members present **at the membership meeting** so it may be known if a quorum is in attendance and shall keep a file system of membership for a period of **4 yrs.** The chairperson shall attend all BOD and general membership meetings.
6. RUNS Chairperson shall be responsible for **documenting** all sponsored Club runs. Shall also record and maintain all Club waivers signed by guests on Club sponsored runs for a period of **7yrs.**

ADD 7. MEMBERS AT LARGE shall serve on committees and/or perform such club duties as determined by the President and/or BOD.

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES AND POWERS OF OFFICERS

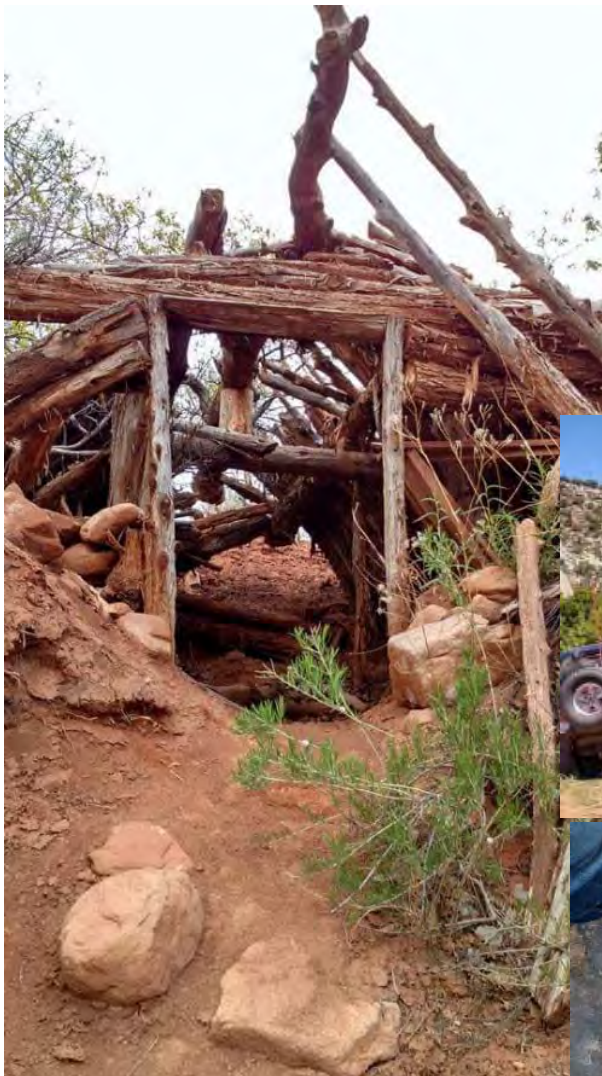
Onion Creek, Thompson Canyon, Polar Mesa

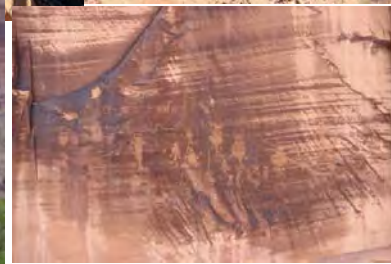

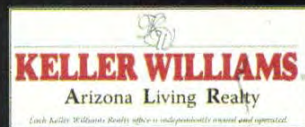

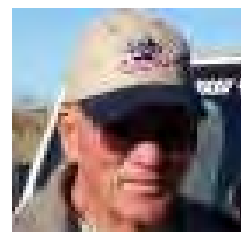

- HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -

- Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on *H4W* runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point all in working order.

RATING	DESCRIPTION
1	EASIEST: Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades.
2	EASY: Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving.
3	EASIEST MODERATE: 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane.
3¼	MODERATE: Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop-offs and tight clearance between rocks.
3½	HARDER MODERATE: For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Potentially dangerous, large rocks, ruts, steep slopes, loose surface and narrow clearances that need to be negotiated.
3¾	HARDEST MODERATE: Skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with both differentials locked, some strapping/winching. Very challenging sections, extremely steep grades, loose surfaces, large rocks, deep ruts and tight clearances.
4	DIFFICULT: Highly skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with belly up, 4 to 1 transfer case or equivalent, skid plates, beefed up axles and suspension system. Probable strapping/winching. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage.
5	HARD: All of the above. Probable body damage.
