A Walk Back in Time

Swansea Townsite, located about 30 miles northeast of Bouse, was once a thriving copper-mining development and now sits in memory of by-gone times.

Prospectors began working the area in 1862. Remarkable silver-lead ore in the Ruby Silver mines revealed a copper deposit. John W. Boyle eventually sold out to the Clara Consolidated Signal Group. The new owners found the key to success: developing the corporation's new line into the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad.

J. Chenoweth, one of the new owners, began looking for investors in 1908. He constructed the smelter. This was the boom year — workload increased, and a water tank was built in 1909. It worked.

The Clara Consolidated expanded the following year. With the greatest number on payroll — 500 at its peak — they built more miles of railway transportation and communication. The town blossomed to a population of about 500 people. It even had a moving-picture house.

After bankruptcy was declared, the mine had several false starts until 1925, when Ernest C. Smith became the manager of a controversial new idea: the “one-man” copper recovery. New adobe houses were built camp-style. This was the same period as the cover photo, taken some-time around 1918.

The decline came with the Great Depression, and the last mill copper was reported in 1944.

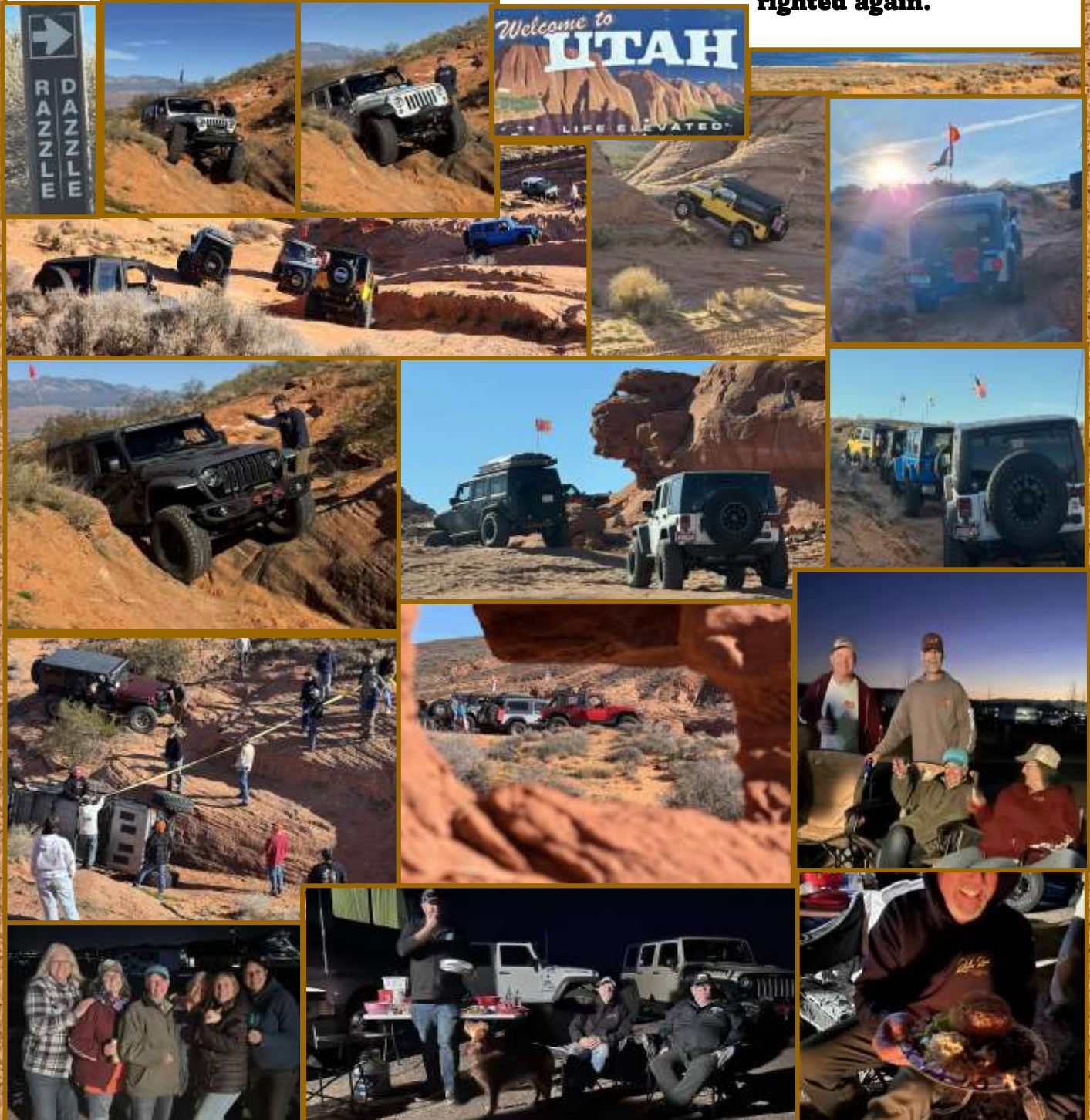

Rating 5 out of 10 1/13/26



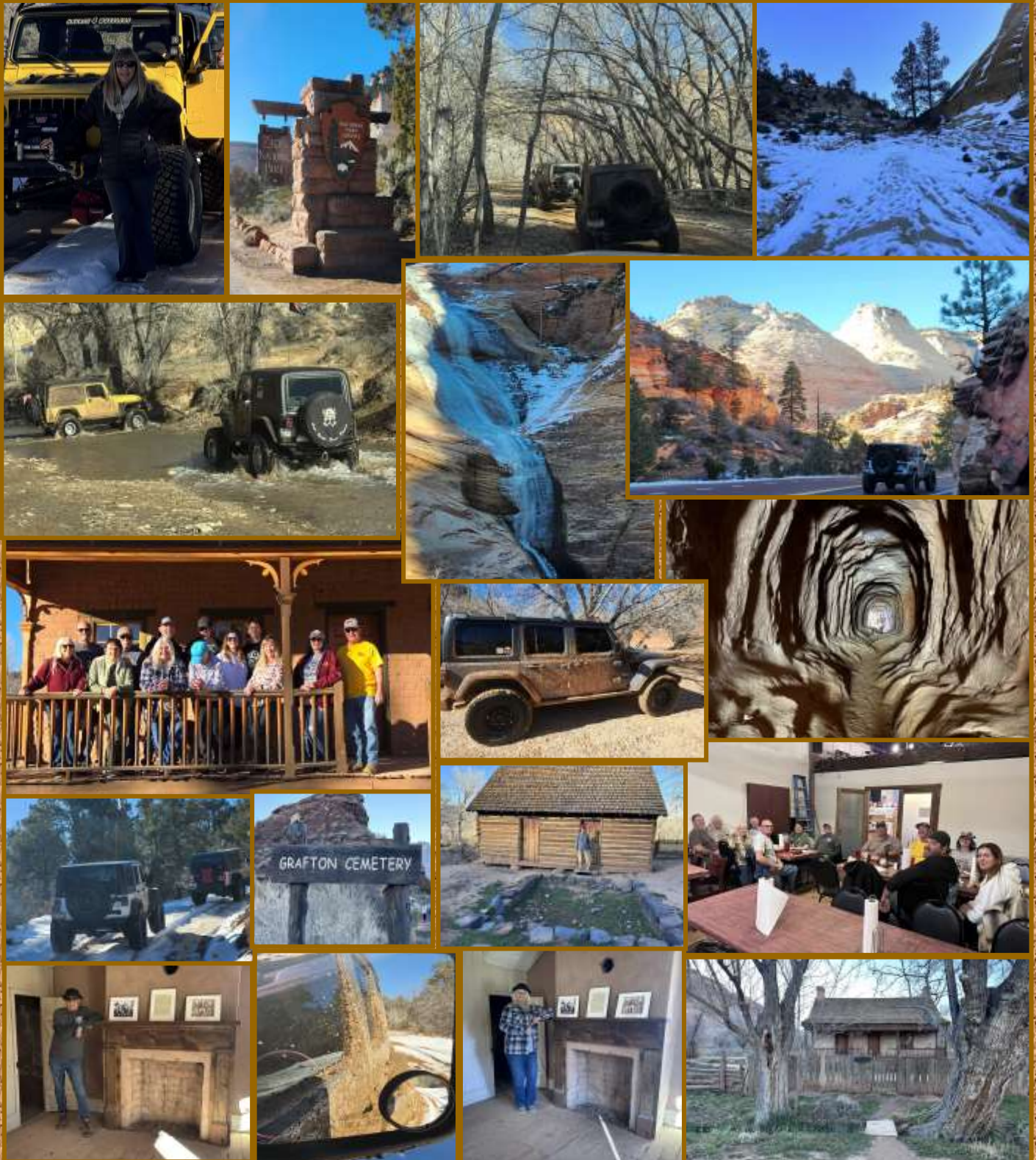

**Barracks Trail/Zion National Park—Led by Dave Blake
Rating 5 of 10 1/14/26**



Narrated by Tammy Blake — Day # 2 of our Utah trip was a full day!! Wheeled the Barrak's trail, river crossings, traveled through Zion National Park. Visited a cute little town which is preserved by an historical site, Grafton, UT. And finished the day off with The Belly Of The Dragon!!



A little history about Grafton Ghost Town....

GRAFTON, UTAH Grafton is a ghost town just south of Zion National Park in Washington County, Utah, United States. Said to be the most photographed ghost town in the West, it has appeared in several films, including *In Old Arizona* (1929)—the first outdoor talkie—and the classic *Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid*. The nearest inhabited town is Rockville, which now includes Grafton within its legal boundaries.

EARLY SETTLEMENT The site was first settled in December 1859 as part of a southern Utah cotton-growing initiative ordered by Brigham Young (see *Utah's Dixie*). A group from Virgin led by Nathan Tenney established a settlement called Wheeler. Wheeler was largely destroyed on January 8, 1862, during a week-long flood of the Virgin River—part of the Great Flood of 1862. The town was rebuilt about a mile upriver and renamed New Grafton, after Grafton, Massachusetts.

GROWTH AND CHALLENGES Grafton grew quickly in its early years. By 1864, there were 28 families, each farming about an acre of land. The community-built irrigation canals and planted orchards, some of which still exist. Grafton briefly served as the county seat of Kane County from January 1866 to January 12, 1867, but boundary changes in 1882 placed it in Washington County. Flooding was a persistent issue. The Virgin River's heavy silt load required residents to dredge irrigation ditches weekly—far more often than in neighboring towns. Grafton's isolation on the south bank of the river added to its challenges. In 1866, during the Black Hawk War, fear of attacks led to a full evacuation to Rockville.

DECLINE Severe flooding discouraged resettlement, and most residents moved to more accessible areas. By 1890, only four families remained. The town's decline is typically marked by the closure of its Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints branch in 1921. The last residents left in 1944. A *United Press* article dated May 23, 1946, reported that movie producer Harry Sherman purchased the town as a film location from William Russell, 80, a descendant of the co-founder and one of the town's three remaining inhabitants.

RESTORATION EFFORTS In June 1997, the Grafton Heritage Partnership was formed to protect and restore the townsite. With support from former residents, the Utah State Historical Society, the BLM, and others, several buildings were restored: the old church, Russell Home, Louisa Foster Home, Berry fence in the cemetery, and John Wood Home. Restoration included new windows, doors, roofing, and structural enhancements to reflect their original period. Additionally, 150 acres of farmland were purchased to maintain the town's agricultural appearance. The site is under 24-hour surveillance. As of 2011, the partnership was seeking a live-in caretaker to oversee preservation.

- HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -
 - Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on *H4W* runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point all in working order.

RATING	DESCRIPTION
1	<u>EASIEST</u> : Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades.
2	<u>EASY</u> : Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving.
3	<u>EASIEST MODERATE</u> : 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane.
3¼	<u>MODERATE</u> : Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop-offs and tight clearance between rocks.
3½	<u>HARDER MODERATE</u> : For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Potentially dangerous, large rocks, ruts, steep slopes, loose surface and narrow clearances that need to be negotiated.
3¾	<u>HARDEST MODERATE</u> : Skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with both differentials locked, some strapping/winchng. Very challenging sections, extremely steep grades, loose surfaces, large rocks, deep ruts and tight clearances.
4	<u>DIFFICULT</u> : Highly skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with belly up, 4 to 1 transfer case or equivalent, skid plates, beefed up axles and suspension system. Probable strapping/winchng. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage.
5	<u>HARD</u> : All of the above. Probable body damage.

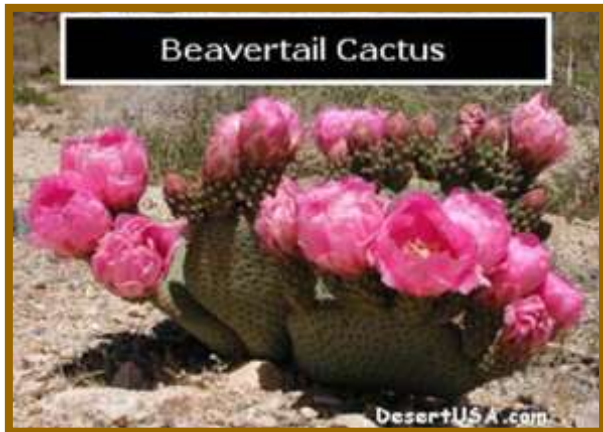

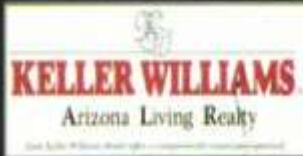

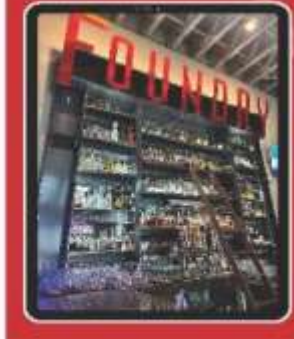
