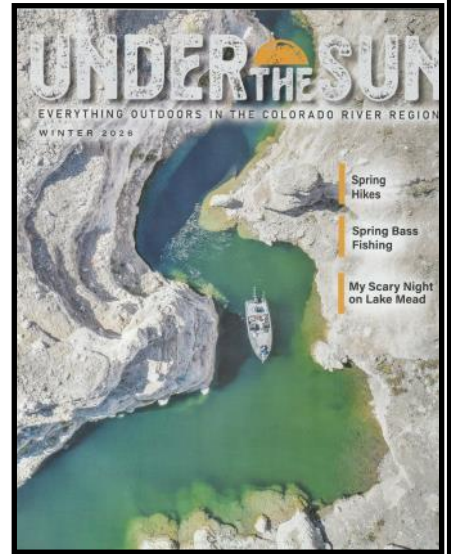
Beyond the Trail

The Havasu 4 Wheelers are known for far more than trail rides and desert adventures. The Lake Havasu City-based club has built a reputation for protecting public lands and keeping them safe, clean, and accessible for everyone.

With roughly 400 members, the group regularly volunteers to fence off hazardous mine shafts, remove trash, and support state agencies with land-management projects. According to past president Willie Williams, mine-shaft fencing remains one of the club's most critical responsibilities. Some shafts drop hundreds of feet and have been linked to fatal accidents. "Some have what we call tailing piles near the opening and some don't," Williams said. "For safety reasons they need to be fenced off."

In 2017, the Bureau of Land Management recognized the club's efforts with its national Fix a Shaft Today award. Members continue to work closely with the BLM on clean-up coordination, land-access issues, and other stewardship initiatives. Williams noted that the reopening of Planet Ranch Road—closed for 32 years—was the result of collaboration between the Havasu 4 Wheelers, the BLM, and the Arizona Peace Trail group.

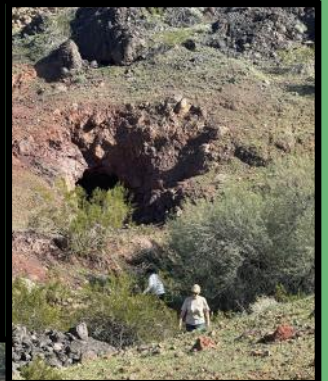
The club also organizes desert clean-ups in areas where members or residents report dumping. One frequent trouble spot is near Bison Boulevard, where recreational shooters often leave targets and debris behind. In addition, the group partners with the Arizona Department of Transportation to maintain a two-mile stretch of State Route 95. Clean-up days begin at the scenic overlook, where members gather for safety instructions before heading out to collect debris.

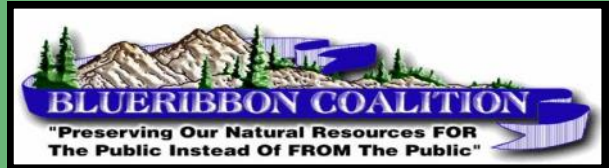

- HAVASU 4 WHEELERS TRAIL RATINGS -

- Mandatory Vehicle Equipment - All vehicles on H4W runs must be 4-wheel drive & equipped with a CB radio, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tow straps, and front and rear tow hooks or safe hitching point all in working order.

RATING	DESCRIPTION
1	<u>EASIEST</u> : Passable by stock vehicles. Gentle fairly wide grades.
2	<u>EASY</u> : Use of 2 wheel and some 4-wheel drive. Trail may have some rocks, loose road surface, and ruts but a reasonable line for driving.
3	<u>EASIEST MODERATE</u> : 4-wheel drive with aggressive tire treads. Expect a rough road with rocks and sand that requires lower tire pressure. Substantial sections of single lane.
3¼	<u>MODERATE</u> : Some 4 wheel driving experience needed. Same as above with some use of high and low range gearing. These trails have a rough, rutted surface, rocks and deep sand. Sections may be steep enough to cause traction problems, narrow shelf roads with steep drop-offs and tight clearance between rocks.
3½	<u>HARDER MODERATE</u> : For experienced drivers. At least a 2" lift and 33' tires with aggressive tire tread, one locked differential, high and low range gearing. Potentially dangerous, large rocks, ruts, steep slopes, loose surface and narrow clearances that need to be negotiated.
3¾	<u>HARDEST MODERATE</u> : Skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with both differentials locked, some strapping/winchng. Very challenging sections, extremely steep grades, loose surfaces, large rocks, deep ruts and tight clearances.
4	<u>DIFFICULT</u> : Highly skilled experienced drivers only. Same as above with belly up, 4 to 1 transfer case or equivalent, skid plates, beefed up axles and suspension system. Probable strapping/winchng. Vehicle width and wheelbase should be considered. Possible body damage.
5	<u>HARD</u> : All of the above. Probable body damage.

"Desert Varnish"

If you enjoy being "on the rocks" in a jeep, you may be surprised to learn that something else enjoys those rocks even more: desert varnish, also known as patina. This dark brown, black, or reddish coating appears on many desert rocks and canyon walls. The black color comes from manganese minerals, while the red tones are produced by iron oxides. Over long periods, wind can polish the surface to a glossy sheen. Despite its appearance, this coating grows extremely slowly—sometimes only 1 to 40 micrometers in a thousand years. Even when it seems to cover a rock completely, it may be only one hundredth of a millimeter thick.

Desert varnish, like many off-roaders, is selective about the rocks it prefers. It tends to form on sandstone but not on granite or limestone, which lack stable surfaces for varnish to adhere to. It is most commonly found on north or east facing walls, possibly because temperature and evaporation rates influence its formation. Surfaces facing south or west dry too quickly in direct sunlight.

How varnish forms is still not fully understood, but two main theories exist. The first suggests that rainwater mixes with clay containing iron and manganese, and these elements oxidize and bond to the rock. The second theory uses the same ingredients but proposes that bacteria drive the chemical reactions.

The ingredients arrive via wind: clay particles, manganese, iron, and bacteria. About 70% of the varnish consists of clay, whose sticky texture holds everything together while chemical reactions occur under the desert sun. Scientists believe the clay also protects bacteria from extreme dryness, heat, and solar radiation. Manganese helps block ultraviolet light. The entire process may take up to 10,000 years, and the darker the varnish, the longer it has been forming.

Early Native Americans used desert varnish to create petroglyphs by scraping or chipping away the dark coating to reveal the lighter rock beneath. Artifacts lying on the ground can also become varnished, helping archaeologists estimate their age. Measuring varnish thickness is also valuable in studying Desert Landforms, revealing how long a rock surface has remained undisturbed.

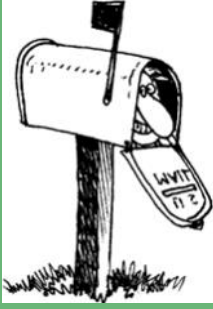

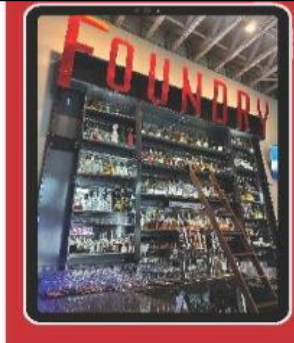
